KENEDY ADOPTS NEW ORDINANCES TO SUPPORT YOUTH PROGRAMS AND JUROR COMPENSATION

The City of Kenedy has passed two new ordinances aimed at strengthening community programs and improving public services. These changes create new opportunities for local youth while ensuring fair compensation for residents who serve as jurors.

Youth Diversion Administrative Fund

Under Ordinance 25-02, the City has established a Youth Diversion Administrative Fund and Fee to support programs that provide alternative pathways for young individuals involved with the municipal court system. Rather than facing traditional penalties, eligible youth will have access to structured programs that focus on education, mentorship, and personal growth. By investing in diversion programs, the City is working to reduce repeat offenses, guide young people toward better choices, and build a stronger, more resilient community.


Juror Reimbursement and Donation Options

With the passage of Ordinance 25-03, jurors will now receive a \$6 reimbursement for their service. In addition, jurors have the option to donate their compensation to community programs and local non-profits, directly contributing to initiatives that benefit Kenedy residents. This new system allows jurors to turn their civic duty into a meaningful way to give back.

National Nutrition Month: Managing Diabetes with the TIDES Program

March is **National Nutrition Month**, a time to focus on making healthier food choices and improving overall well-being. For those managing diabetes or prediabetes, understanding how nutrition plays a role in daily health is essential. The TIDES Diabetes Program at Otto Kaiser Memorial Hospital provides free education, support, and resources to help individuals take charge of their health.

TIDES, which stands for Take-Charge Initiative for Diabetes through Education and Support, offers one-on-one counseling, group classes, and community events designed to provide personalized self-management plans for diabetes. Through this program, participants receive guidance on key topics such as healthy eating, physical activity, blood sugar monitoring, stress management, medication use, and reducing the risk of complications.

The program now offers three types of free group events to help community members build confidence in managing their diabetes:

- **Diabetes 101 Course** A 1.5 to 2-hour session covering all aspects of diabetes self-management, including nutrition, stress reduction, and blood sugar monitoring.
- Grocery Store Tours at Kenedy Walmart A walking tour through the grocery aisles with a diabetes educator, teaching participants how to make healthier food choices. Group sizes are limited to six people per session, and the tour lasts about 1 hour and 15 minutes—so wear comfortable shoes!
- **Diabetes Lunch-and-Learn Seminars** Held every other month, these educational sessions feature a free lunch and discussions on diabetes-related topics chosen by health educators. Topics vary, and suggestions for future discussions are welcome.

Managing diabetes can be overwhelming, but with the right support, it's possible to live a healthier and more active life. Diabetes self-management programs like TIDES have been shown to improve A1C levels, blood pressure, cholesterol, and overall well-being while helping participants gain confidence in making informed lifestyle choices.

Anyone can be referred to the program by a physician or by calling Diabetes Educator Theresa Fenner at 830-583-9304 or emailing <u>Theresa.Fenner@okmh.org</u> to schedule a free consultation. The program also provides free glucose meters and test strips and can help participants find ways to lower out-of-pocket medication costs.
